What is the Ameren Illinois Energy Efficiency Summer Internship Program?




- It is our goal to grow the number of local candidates working in the energy efficiency field throughout central and southern Illinois.

How it Works

- Employer application open March 5 April 11.
- Fully funded 8-12-week summer internships.
- Interns will receive mentorship from professionals, learn new skills, understand energy efficiency concepts and receive career development support during and after the program ends.

Sample: NEF Job Description

National Energy Foundation (NEF) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit educational organization based in Salt Lake City, Utah. NEF's mission is to cultivate and promote energy literacy. NEF achieves its mission through the implementation of student and teacher education programs focused on energy, natural resources and through the custom development of premier instructional materials.

NEF is looking to hire a seasonal summer employee who will provide program level support to our energy efficiency education programs. This person will work under the direction of the Program Coordinator and the Program Director and will assist in the design, enrollment, recruitment and implementation of program. This is an entry-level position that will introduce this candidate to careers in energy efficiency as it relates to education. This employee will work 40 hours a week, up to 480 hours this summer and will work in person with our Salt Lake City, UT team.

Responsibilities

The candidate will support teacher and school recruitment efforts by assisting in the design of marketing materials, the research of eligible school and teacher participants and the development of a robust in-classroom presentation that accompanies program curriculum. The candidate will conduct research, collect data and gather best practices from other NEF energy efficiency education programs. The candidate will learn about program implementation and will help the Program Coordinator with logistics related to in-person classroom presentations.

Qualifications, Education, Experience and Skills

The ideal candidate will be:

- Teachable
- Responsible
- Reliable
- Passionate
- Self-motivated
- Results-oriented

- Have excellent communication skills both written and oral
- Have computer skills email, Google Sheets, Excel and more
- Demonstrate problem-solving skills
- Have excellent people skills



Employer Commitments

- Required to sign a Memorandum of Agreement.
- Must be able to provide:
 - → A 8 12 week internship opportunity.
 - → A work week between 30 40 hours per week.
 - Employ the participant.
- Provide on-the-job training and coaching with career development information specific to the position.
- Follow and teach highest safety standards possible for this position.
- Require the intern to participate in the Ameren Illinois Energy Efficiency webinars and events provided throughout the summer. (This requirement should not take more than 20% of the internship length.)
- Proactively communicate successes or challenges with Ameren Illinois.
- Send invoices to SEEL (should include employer and milestone information).



Ameren Illinois Commitments

- Provide funding for summer internship.
- Host kickoff, wrap-up and volunteer events.
- Host six webinars that provide interns with information about working in the energy efficiency field.
- Ameren Illinois will serve as a resource for the participant throughout the summer.



Hiring Requirements

- Positions are open to entry-level jobseekers, including:
 - > High school upperclassmen
 - > College undergraduate students
 - Graduate students
 - > Adults looking for new a career path



Weekly Webinars

- Six weekly virtual webinars.
- Intern collaboration, introduction to Ameren Illinois staff.
- Topics include:
 - > Customer Service
 - > Energy efficiency basics
 - > Future technologies: smart home, smart grid, electric vehicles
 - > Income qualified and innovative energy efficiency programs
 - > Weatherization
 - Career and workforce development
